



DIESEL TECHNICIAN JOB DESCRIPTION

CLASSIFICATION: Hourly, Non-Exempt

SUMMARY

The primary duties of the Diesel Technician include performing diagnostic tests on diesel vehicles to find faults, analyzing diagnostic test results and repairing or replacing engine, steering, transmission, braking or lighting system components. Completion of detailed summaries of serviced vehicles and well as interacting with customers required on a daily basis.

RESPONSIBILITIES MAY INCLUDE

- Running diagnostic tests on vehicles.
- Analyzing diagnostic test results.
- Replacing vehicle engines, steering mechanisms, transmissions, and braking systems.
- Checking vehicle lighting systems.
- Test driving vehicles to gauge performance.
- Performing preventative maintenance on service trucks.
- Adhering to an inspection procedure checklist.
- Ensuring the cleanliness of the shop.

REQUIREMENTS

- Valid driver's license or learner's permit and a good driving record.
- Solid knowledge of diesel engine components.
- Good diagnostic skills.
- Proficiency with maintenance and repair tools.
- Attention to detail and good organizational skills.
- Excellent verbal communication skills.
- Degree or Diploma in Mechanical or Automotive Engineering a plus.
- ASE Diesel Certification a plus.
- Ability to pass a background check and drug screen.
- Ability to operate a motor vehicle and drive for periods of time.
- Ability to work outdoors, and drive in changing weather conditions.
- Basic computer skills and familiarity with Microsoft Word, Excel, and Outlook.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS

- Ability to lift up to 50 lbs. with tools or assistance.
- Ability to stand, kneel, bend, crawl, and to lift arms above shoulder level for extended periods of time.
- Ability to walk distance of the location's property and stand on feet for an eight-hour work shift.
